This event is our first 10/10 TREC aimed at both novice and established TREC riders. It will be an ideal introduction to our fun sport of TREC, and classes 3 & 4 will suit those of you who are already hooked to brush up your skills.

Please read the information on tack and equipment

Entries – email entry form and pay by bank transfer using TREC 10 as reference [bank details on entry form] or send cheque with entry form to secretary.

If entering pairs classes you can pay individually but please include your pairs name in the notes section.

Closing date: Sat August 17th August 2019 or earlier if full. Entries limited to 50 riders

This event will be run under TREC GB rules.

Times will be emailed to each individual on the Wednesday preceding the event.

Water: please bring your own

Junior riders aged under 14 on day may only ride in pairs class with a rider aged over 18

Remember – please allow time on the day to check the course list, read notes and walk the Obstacle course.

There will be an organised course walk at 9.00 am prompt

<u>Class 1. NOVICE / [individual]</u> Combination of horse and rider not have come 1st, 2nd or 3rd at an affiliated Level 1 competition or higher.

Class 2. NOVICE / [pairs]

At least one of the pair - combination of horse and rider not have come 1st, 2nd or 3rd at an affiliated Level 1 competition or higher.

Pairs ride Phases 1& 2 individually

Phase 1. MA / Control of paces 100m in length. Horse required to canter as slowly as possible along a measured track then walk as fast as possible along the same distance. Points given on a sliding scale. A break of pace / stepping out of corridor results in a zero score for that pace.

Phase 2. <u>PTV / Obstacles.</u> 10 obstacles with a maximum of 10 points at each. Full details of obstacles and scoring will be available on the day. The emphasis will be on the type of obstacle you may meet in a full outdoor TREC competition. These sections take place in an open field.

Phase 3 <u>POR / Orienteering.</u> Approx 10k route. Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy their route from a master map onto a provided map. where advice on map reading will be available. 10 map based questions to be answered. There may also be markers / tickets to be found enroute

An optimum speed will be given for the whole route [to be advised on day]

Class 3 OPEN [individual] & Class 4 OPEN [pairs]

Phases 1 & 2 as for Class 1 & 2

Phase 3 <u>POR / Orienteering</u>. Approx 10 k route Competitors will have 10 minutes in the map room to copy a route from a master map onto a provided map. They will also have 10 challenges which will consist of map based questions [may include grid references] to answer in the map room and en route plus markers / tickets to be found en route. Different map scales may be used.

An optimum speed will be given for the whole route [to be advised on day]

Please note - for all classes there is a small roadwork section on a very quiet lane. There are gates on the route which will need to be opened and closed, however they are all bridlegates and are easy to do. There are wooded sections and sections which follow field margins.

Entry fee:

All CLASSES £30 per rider SETG and TREC GB

£35 non members [includes day membership of SETG to cover insurance]

Rosettes to 6th place

TACK / DRESS / EQUIPMENT

Tack – any safe well-fitting tack
Any safe/comfortable clothing with suitable safe footwear

Compulsory equipment

Riders must wear a hat approved to current BRC [2017] standards.

Riders must wear shoes or boots with a small heel or use caged stirrups.

Hi viz clothing – minimum of stripes on rider's torso, but more is recommended

Horse ID attached to the horse with the rider's details and the emergency phone numbers

Rider ID worn on rider with the emergency phone numbers

Flu Vaccinations: C&REC requires that all events, including training & camps, involving equines should insist that vaccinations are up to date (12 month cycle) and check passports before horses are unloaded. Horses that have had their annual vaccination or a booster, within the last six days of the event should not be allowed to compete. For unvaccinated horses to be able to compete a new programme takes a minimum of 28 days.
